

# Official Map Of The Reedy Fork Trail

- (A) Trail Starts/Gravel Parking Lot.
- (B) Lake Brandt Dam & Greensboro Water Works.
- (C) Reedy Fork Creek Split.
- (D) Private Property – Please stay South of this area to avoid trespassing charges. Thank you.
- (E) Lake View – Take a rest and enjoy the view, the area is filled with waterfowl of all types.
- (F) Private Property – The power lines and surrounding areas across Plainfield Road are off-limits to bikes & hikers. This is private property to the North. Cross the bridge, the remainder of the trail will be on your right.

4 miles of semi-technical one-way – wooded doubletrack (Difficulty 3\*)

\* (Difficulty is an overall estimate, 1 being "easy" & 5 being most "difficult". Always use caution when riding a trail you are unfamiliar with and remember that trail conditions are subject to change.)

From I-40 take 220 North – 220 will become Battleground Avenue North, continue for about 5 miles, then take the Lawndale Drive exit (right fork). You will continue on Lawndale for 2.5 miles, this will turn into Lake Brandt Road. Continue on Lake Brandt Road for approximately 1.5 miles. You will see a pumping station and Lake Higgins Dam, the Reedy Fork trail entrance will be immediately on your right. Park in the gravel lot. Please ride only on the designated trail area, the land across the gravel road (Plainfield Road) at the end of the trail is off-limits to bikes.
